As the new school year approaches, Jefferson County Public Health (JCPH) is reminding families how important it is to ensure their children are up to date on all recommended vaccinations.

Vaccines are safe, effective and can protect children from serious illnesses, such as measles. Getting vaccinated before school starts gives the body time to build immunity and helps prevent early outbreaks that can disrupt not only learning but also work time for parents.

We are committed to supporting families by making vaccines easy to access and offering care in ways that fit their needs. That includes in-clinic appointments, home visits (if eligible) and a mobile clinic that brings services directly to Jeffco neighborhoods.

All services are confidential and available at no cost or low-cost. Our clinic is open Monday through Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with outreach clinics occurring on Thursday throughout the community. To schedule an appointment, families can call 303-239-7040.
