In response, the City has built a coordinated team focused on outreach, mental health support, and pathways to stable housing—helping dozens of neighbors move off the streets in 2024—while keeping public safety and a sense of safety at the forefront.

#### **Volunteer Victim Advocates Needed**

Victim Outreach Incorporated (VOI) is seeking compassionate community members to serve as volunteer victim advocates. VOI is a nonprofit organization that supports victims of crime and trauma, helping them access resources that protect their rights and promote healing, safety, and hope.

Volunteer advocates are called by police to respond on-scene during evenings or weekends, offering emotional support, information, and guidance to individuals in crisis. These volunteers play a vital role in helping victims take their first steps toward recovery.

VOI provides comprehensive training on the dynamics of victimization, crisis intervention, and the criminal justice system. Advocates gain valuable experience working directly with law enforcement and serving people in need—right here in Golden and neighboring communities.


