The year 2025 has been filled with accomplishments, including a number of facility improvements such as the upcoming installation of a new restroom facility next to the Pavilion. Additionally, significant locomotive repair, railcar refurbishment and repainting projects have enhanced the Museum's collection. As you review the list, I hope you'll see how committed the Colorado Railroad Museum is to the ongoing preservation of Colorado's rich railroading legacy.

New Exhibit: Now Open!

Traqueros: Mexican Trackworkers and the American Railroad

This past month, the Museum proudly unveiled its newest exhibit, *Traqueros: Mexican Trackworkers and the American Railroad.* This compelling exhibition sheds light on the largely untold stories of the *traqueros*—the Mexican and Mexican American laborers who built and maintained America's railroads from the late 19th century through the mid-20th century.

Through a powerful collection of artifacts, photographs, and personal narratives, the exhibit honors the resilience, skill, and contributions of these workers. It also explores the



Bracero Program, a World War II-era labor initiative that brought Mexican workers to the U.S. to address labor shortages in essential industries, including railroads.

Traqueros marks the Museum's first fully bilingual exhibit, advancing the Museum's mission

of conveying the rich history of railroading in the Rocky Mountain region to the proudest possible audience. The exhibit will remain on display through August 2026.



Building A Better Museum!

Progress Continues in Golden

If you have visited the Museum in the second half of 2025. you may have noticed several exciting improvements in the works. This year, the Museum is adding restroom facilities next to the Pavilion, ready for use during this year's THE POLAR EXPRESS™ event. Additional lighting was also installed in the lower gallery, enhancing the exhibit space and making the displays

easier to see.

The new viewing platform beneath the trainshed canopy (just east of the Depot) has now been installed and is ready to welcome Colorado Midland observation-chair car No. 111 upon completion of its exterior restoration, which is expected in 2026. Chicago, Burlington & Quincy business car No. 96 is already positioned under the canopy, offering a glimpse of what's to come once the platform opens for public access. Together, these displays will showcase two iconic pieces of Colorado's rich railroad history, and help preserve these late 1880s artifacts in the process.

In addition, the Museum closed on another parcel of property this year, supporting future growth and planned facilities expansion in the coming years. Thanks to two transformative \$100,000 Challenge Grants provided by Dave Ropchan and Barb Melby, along with generous support from numerous other donors, the Museum has raised over \$600,000 toward its property acquisition efforts since these began in 2024. Another Challenge Grant of \$40,000 is now available, continuing to build momentum for this important initiative.

The Roundhouse team has made significant strides in restoration work, including the rehabilitation of 1887-vintage Colorado Midland observation-chair car No. 111 and the

ongoing cab rebuild of Colorado's oldest steam locomotive, Denver, Leadville & Gunnison No. 191. In addition to these projects, the tender tank of Denver & Rio Grande Western steam locomotive No. 491 is nearly complete, with just a few more rivets that need to be placed on the new water cistern before it is repainted. Once finished, No. 491 will be ready to pull THE POLAR EXPRESS™ for the 2025 season. Meanwhile, Rio Grande streamlined F units Nos. 5771 and 5762 have received a fresh coat of paint, and are only awaiting lettering and final details for restoration to their final operational paint scheme to be complete. Additionally, Rio Grande Southern (RGS) Caboose 0404 is being rehabilitated in Durango and is making great progress. If all goes according to plan, the caboose will join RGS No. 20 for its special excursions on the Durango & Silverton in 2026. In other exciting news, a recent announcement revealed that Denver & Rio Grande Western steam locomotive No. 223 will be restored to operation through a partnership between Ogden City, the 223 Locomotive Foundation, and the Colorado Railroad Museum. Once restored, the 1881-built C-16 locomotive will operate for the public across Colorado's narrow-gauge railroads, with plans for a permanent home at the Museum. What will your legacy be? Many longtime supporters of the Colorado Railroad Museum have realized the importance of preserving


