# Food Bank Support at GCC and Beyond

Due to the ongoing federal government shutdown, many Colorado families may see reduced or delayed SNAP (food assistance) benefits this month. In Colorado, \$120 million in SNAP Benefits is allocated monthly to 614,000 residents: 50% are children, 10% over the age of 65, and 15% living with disabilities. In Jefferson County, 1 in 13 residents already face food insecurity.

To help, the City of Golden and Hunger Free Golden are hosting a community food drive at the Golden Community Center, Nov. 1–Dec. 31. Please consider donating non-perishable items such as:

- Canned or boxed soups, chillis, etc.
- Precooked rice meals (Knorr sides, Ben's Original, etc.)
- Canned vegetables, fruit, and beans
- Tuna (cans or pouches)
- Nut butters & jams
- Pasta & Sauces (spaghetti, macaroni, tomato sauce, etc.)
- Pantry snacks (crackers, cookies, granola bars)
- Cereal products (oatmeal, granola, cereal, etc.)

Local food pantries have already seen a 40% increase in people accessing help this year, and with anticipated demand in the coming weeks, they also need monetary donations, gift cards for food and gas, and volunteers. # Road and Construction Updates

#### **Right of Way Impacts**

Unless otherwise noted, all impacts will be in effect on weekdays from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (holidays excluded). Closures will be specifically noted.

Construction is continuing as part of Golden's 2025 Street Improvement Program.

To keep crews and drivers safe, no parking will be allowed in active work zones from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The City may tow any vehicles parked in these areas during work hours to a nearby location outside the work zone.

During paving, vehicle access will be limited, and drivers should plan to use alternate routes when possible. Traffic will be directed around work areas by flaggers, and streets will reopen as soon as repairs are complete.

Residents should expect construction equipment, traffic, and noise while work is in progress. The contractor will deliver door-hanger notices 48 hours in advance to homes directly affected and will also post "No Parking" signs at least 48 hours before work begins.

Please note that schedules may change quickly due to weather or equipment issues, so be sure to follow the posted signs for the most current information.


