# We're Building a Better Museum!

Progress and Projects
Continue

In 2025, the Colorado Railroad Museum has continued to make significant strides in its commitment to preserving Colorado's railroad legacy, achieving major restoration milestones and enhancing the visitor experience.

Restoration work continued on historic locomotives and rolling stock. Denver & Rio Grande Western No. 491 received a full tender rebuild and over 2,000 faux rivets to preserve its historic appearance. Its restoration was completed just in time for it to return to service, pulling THE



POLAR EXPRESS™ trains this holiday season. Supporting No. 491 this holiday season is Denver & Rio Grande Western No. 315, which recently arrived in Golden via truck through a special partnership with the Durango Railroad Historical Society. In Durango, restoration of the Museum's Rio Grande Southern caboose No. 0404 progressed, and it is expected to join special winter excursions behind Rio Grande Southern No. 20 along the Durango & Silverton route. Meanwhile, iconic Rio Grande diesel locomotives Nos. 5771 and 5762 were repainted into the single stripe paint scheme made famous during their years pulling the *Rio Grande Zephyr*, with re-lettering and reinstallation of side grilles and appliances planned for

the coming months.

Progress on the rolling stock canopy included the installation of a new raised steel platform, protecting prized pieces of rolling stock while providing fully accessible viewing opportunities. A second track will be constructed in 2026, and Colorado Midland observation car No. 111 will join Chicago, Burlington & Quincy business car No. 96 under the canopy once its exterior restoration is finished, completing this long-awaited facility upgrade. Additionally, a new restroom facility was placed next to the Pavilion, providing long-needed amenities on the east side of the Museum's campus.

The Museum also debuted *Traqueros: Mexican Trackworkers and the American Railroad*, a powerful new exhibit honoring the largely untold contributions of Mexican laborers to the U.S. rail industry from the late 19th through mid-20th century.

The progress noted above doesn't include many other projects that have been ongoing in the area of restoration and maintenance for the Museum's unparalleled collection of full-sized locomotives and rolling stock. There's so much going on in Golden! All of this progress is possible thanks to support from numerous donors.


