There was no Mondays with the Mayor this week. We'll see you again in the New Year!



#### **East Amenity Zone Vision Plan Draft**

#### **Christmas Tree Recycling**

The City of Golden offers a simple and eco-friendly way to dispose of your Christmas tree - by giving it a second life as mulch!

You can drop off your tree at our NEW collection site located at The Splash, 3151 Illinois St., through January 26, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. daily.

To participate, please ensure your tree meets the following guidelines:

- Remove all ornaments, hardware, strings of lights, and tinsel.
- Only live Christmas trees will be accepted.
- Wreaths, tree branches, trash bags, or other wood materials will not be accepted.

The collected trees will be turned into mulch, which will be available for free pickup at a later date at the public site on 11th St., just west of the Clear Creek History Park.


